Shared cottages allow for living larger in Muskoka

Single cottages will have a library with a window seat and a two-storey great room with large panelled windows and a two-sided fireplace.

The cottages will have a slightly different aesthetic from the usual Muskoka-style ones, most noticeably, a six-sided Muskoka room in the villas that will be surrounded by windows that face the water, and be topped with a pointed roof.

The villas are also designed to provide maximum privacy, so residents can do such things as barbecue on their decks without their neighbours seeing them.

Recreational facilities will include a lounge, library, billiards table and games area in the clubhouse.

Future phases will include a welcome centre with tuck shop and theatre room, as well as tennis courts and a fitness centre with indoor and outdoor pool, hot tub and spa.

Pathways and boardwalks will connect the cottages to two beaches, a boathouse and six docks. Residents will have free use of canoes, kayaks and paddleboats.

The annual maintenance fee of \$2,350 will cover all utilities, cable, Internet, taxes, insurance, housekeeping, replacement reserve and operating contingency.

Neighbouring towns such as Huntsville and Orillia offer a selection of restaurants and shops, festivals and craft shows, boating tours and parks.
